It was performed in the film and on record by Glenn Miller and his orchestra, with vocals by Ray Eberle and Pat Friday. An orchestral version of the song without lyrics first appeared in that movie in 1941. In 1960, it was covered by blues singer Etta James in an arrangement that improvised on Warren's melody.
