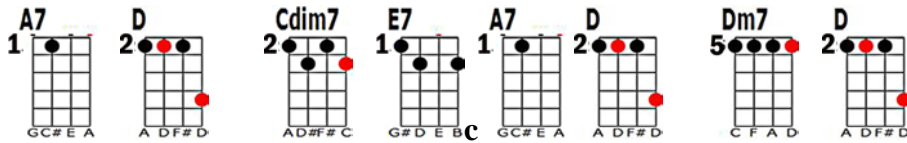


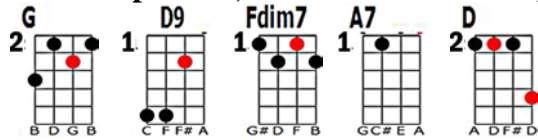

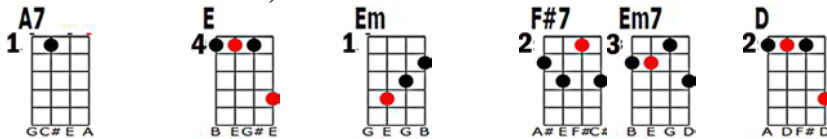

If you're ever up a tree, call on me;

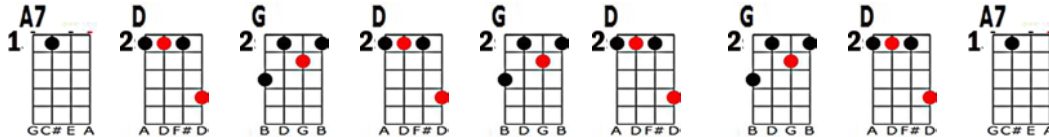

If you're ever up a tree, phone to me;

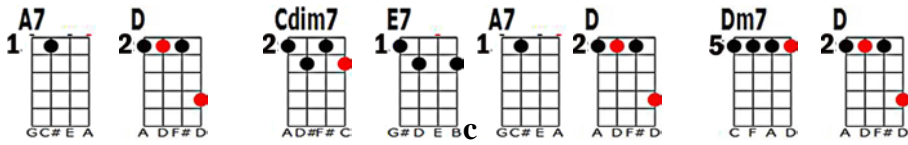

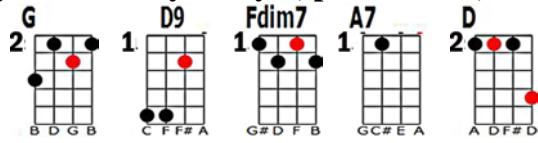

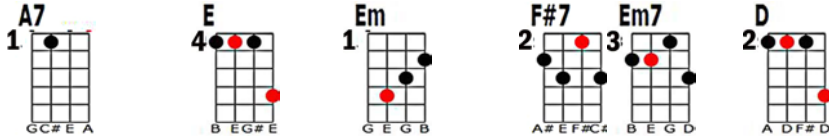
