Cole Porter's number, "I've Got You Under My Skin" was introduced by Virginia Bruce in the 1936 MGM musical Born to Dance. It is unusual in that the song has no verse. It was standard practice with most popular songs to have a verse to WE GOT TO DANCE with most popular songs to chorus. Ironically most of the time tunes are performed without the verse anyway. The lyrics of relate FROM BORN TO DANCE to a deep infatuation "so deep in my heart, you're really a part of me."
