"Manhattan" The music was written by Richard Rodgers and the words by Lorenz Hart for the 1925 revue "Garrick Gaieties". It was introduced by Sterling Holloway and June ANHATTAN Cochran. The song describes, in several choruses, the simple delights of Manhattan for a young couple. Since its debut, FROM THE BROADWAY MUSICAL THE GARRICK GAIETIES it has regularly appeared in popular culture. It was first heard on the silver screen in the 1929 short Makers Of Melody, a tribute to Rodgers and Hart WORDS BY LORENZ HART
