

Mitzi Green introduced "My Funny Valentine" in the Broadway musical, *Babes in Arms*. Her character, Susie Ward, sang to Ray Heatherton whose character was (conveniently) named Valentine, "Val" White. The show opened at the Schubert Theater on April 14, 1937, and ran for 289 performances. "My Funny Valentine" subsequently went onto the recording charts in 1945, *Babes in Arms* was adapted to the big screen by MGM in 1939 and was the third in a series of nine movies starring Mickey Rooney and Judy Garland.
